THE INFLUENCE OF IPL AND TNPL IN THE CRICKETING PSYCHOLOGY OF THE PLAYERS IN TAMIL NADU

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ABSTRACT--This paper aims to study the resultant factors linked to the success of Indian Premier League and its influence in regional cricket. It also aims to find out the impact of these ensuing factors in the rise of Tamil Nadu Premiere League and the reaction of the regional cricketers. With a set of questions prepared to identify the attitude of cricketers, the study aims at unearthing the real spirit of the people of Tamil Nadu towards cricket. The response of the players have been analysed with visual representations and the findings have been clearly stated at the end.

I. INTRODUCTION

To play sport in Tamil Nadu means to play cricket to most of the people like many other states in India. However, in recent times, the game of Cricket has undergone so many new developments and it is not the same to the people of the contemporary world as to how it was two decades before, though the basic structural framework of the game is retained. From test cricket during the seventies came the one day international cricket style. After that, for the people of the 21st century, according to the taste, there came the T20 cricket. India adopted this version of cricket and introduced the Indian Premier League. It is a platform where all the cricket players including foreign players are grouped into different teams. These different teams will represent eight different regions of the nation.

Indian Premier League is a huge success and it has grown to be the second richest Professional League in the World next only to NBA at a brand value of \$ 4.3 billion (Meenakshi, 2016). The huge success of this magnitude of Indian Premier League has attracted not only people in India but also all over the world to emulate the contest. Indian Premier League has established a benchmark of Cricket marketing in the whole Cricket World and has brought the world to India. It has also evolved into the most fashionable and entertaining Sports League in India (Shams, 2012). It is stated that one of the main aims of BCCI at the back of the launch of Indian Premier League is to advance the capabilities of domestic players and provide them a much competitive and better platform in contrast to the usual domestic circle of cricketing pattern. Of course besides this, another major reason for the launch of Indian Premier League was to create a profitable league tournament as well (Singh, 2011). The game has become a part of every discussion and it is even getting integrated in the teaching of classrooms. Even

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educationalists are beginning to believe that the popularity that the game has can be productively used for other skill development among the children in schools and colleges (Vasanthan.R & Nandhini.R, 2014).

Following the nation, the various states started promoting their own leagues to take cricketing to the grass root level. Tamil Nadu Premier League is one such regional tournament initiatives organised by Tamil Nadu to take cricket to the corners of the state and to identify potential players from various parts of the state. The Tamil Nadu Premier League aims to reach the benefits of the game to the local talented youth.

It is an interesting development in the cricketing world of this region and not many studies have been conducted on the present day attitude and mindset that the game has created among the players. This study will delve into the mindset of the present day cricketers with regard to the opportunities and facilities available for them to make a career out of the game and also to develop their skills in the game. The challenges faced by the players due to their own mind set and that of the society, the country, the world, the media, the advertising agency, the sponsors, etc, are worth investigating.

II. NEED OF THE STUDY

Cricket being one of the main games played all over India, the widespread interest in the game is a given. The essence of physical fitness felt by the people and the growth in general knowledge on health and well being are behind the increase in entry into cricket and other sports as well. Today, the Indian Premier League (IPL) is a super hit in India and the Tamil Nadu Premier League attracts as much attention as the IPL in this part of the country. It is essential to know how far these games have sent out a message in giving a rise of hope for everyone to achieve big in the field. This hope is essential because this is what will actually bring the talented youth out in the arena to try out their luck in the game. A systematic study will help to make understand the psychological impact created by the Tamil Nadu Premier League among the cricketing youth of the region.

III. METHODOLOGY

A proper study has not been carried out to find out the psychological condition of the players in the past as well as players in the present time of active cricketing through Tamil Nadu Premier League. A systematic study has been planned in this way in the form of interviewing players of the present time as well as players in the past, what exactly they feel about the game. By interviewing people who played regularly some time we will know the kind of atmosphere they had when they were playing. We will also know about what they feel about the playing conditions and the scope for cricketers in the present day scenario. Interviewing players who play regularly at present will help us to confirm the assumptions that we have with regard to the mental condition of these people. For this essay, a set of 10 questions are prepared and circulated among the players of today as well as players in the past to verify the assumptions that the researchers have in mind.

IV. RESEARCH QUESTIONS

1) Do/Did you feel you have a career as a cricketer?

To feel that each and everyone has a career in the game while playing is essential. It is the real factor for motivation alongside involvement in the act of playing the game. The opinion of people with regard to the same will help us to know the attitude that they have as players.




Figure 1.1: Feeling of a career as a cricketer




Figure 1.2: Chance to play cricket as a career for all people with talent in the game




Figure 1:3: Chance to develop skills in the game




Figure 1.4: Readiness to sponsor cricketers




Figure 1.5: Scope of cricketers in other games




Figure 1.6: Availability of proper infrastructure to develop skills




Figure 1.7: Awareness in parents to encourage children for cricket




Figure 1.8: Availability of proper coaches for learning the game




Figure 1.9: Encouragement of schools and colleges for cricket among students




Figure 1.10: Encouragement for cricket players in general
